17.30 Tour of Gallen-Kallela Museum

At the Gallen-Kallela Museum, you'll get a glimpse into the life, numerous journeys, and the people encountered by Akseli Gallen-Kallela (1865–1931) through his beloved art. Tarvaspää, designed by the artist himself, is one of Finland's most significant studio villas from the early 20th century. The museum area with its buildings has been designated as nationally significant built cultural environment.

14 Study visit to EMMA Espoo Museum of Modern Art

Emma - Espoo Museum of Modern Art is an art museum in Tapiola, Espoo, focusing on Finnish and international modernism, contemporary art, and design. Join us for a tour of the remarkable Collection Kakkonen, featuring over 10,000 art and design treasures. From Finnish ceramic and glass art to international design classics, the exhibition offers a captivating journey through the evolution of Finnish design. We will also explore Tapio Wirkkala's dynamic sculptures and design ethos in exhibition Form, showcasing nature-inspired creativity through nine perspectives.

*During the coffee break there is an option for another study visit in the next-door museums Leikki and Kruunu. Leikki is a museum dedicated to childhood, toys and play, offering interesting, nostalgic and touching cultural experiences for all ages. Kruunu is the only Nordic museum specialising in watches and jewellery. The mission of the museum is to tell the story of the watch and jewellery industry through a series of changing main exhibitions.

17-19 The Concert of children's International Summer Summit Choral Festival (organized by Tapiola Choir) at Tapiola School. On Stage over 100 singers from different choirs.

19.30 Additional concluding dinner at Tapiola Garden Hotel Restaurant for those leaving on late Friday or Saturday
