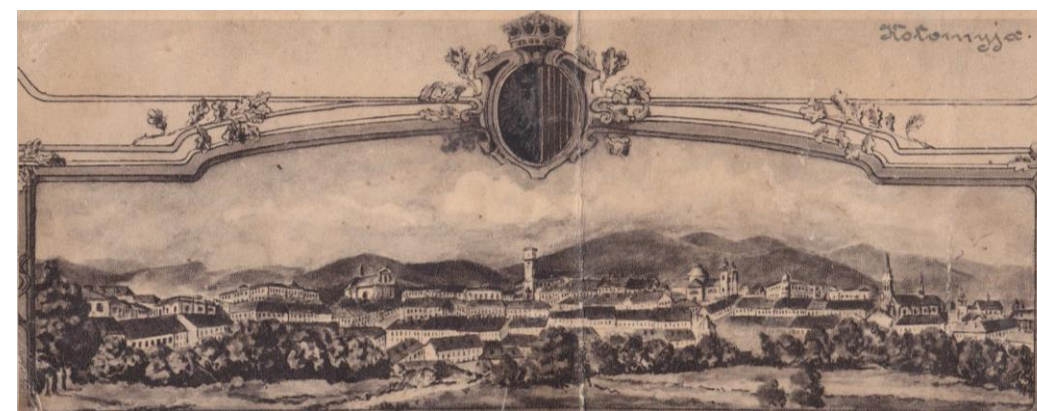
Distance from Kolomyia to large cities:

Kolomyia was first mentioned in documents in 1241 in the context of the princely rights to salt. Over its 780-year history, the city has risen from ashes several times after nomadic raids, witnessed the signing of inter-state treaties, was the second city of Galicia after Lviv, and combined the lively movement of people with the noise of trains on its main street. The first figures of the Austro-Hungarian Empire lived here, and the first Ukrainian theater in this region was founded here. Some historians claim that the first Ukrainian to step on the land of the New World was a resident of Kolomyia. Every building, street, and even old window shutters echo Kolomyia's rich history — a history that shapes the city's present.

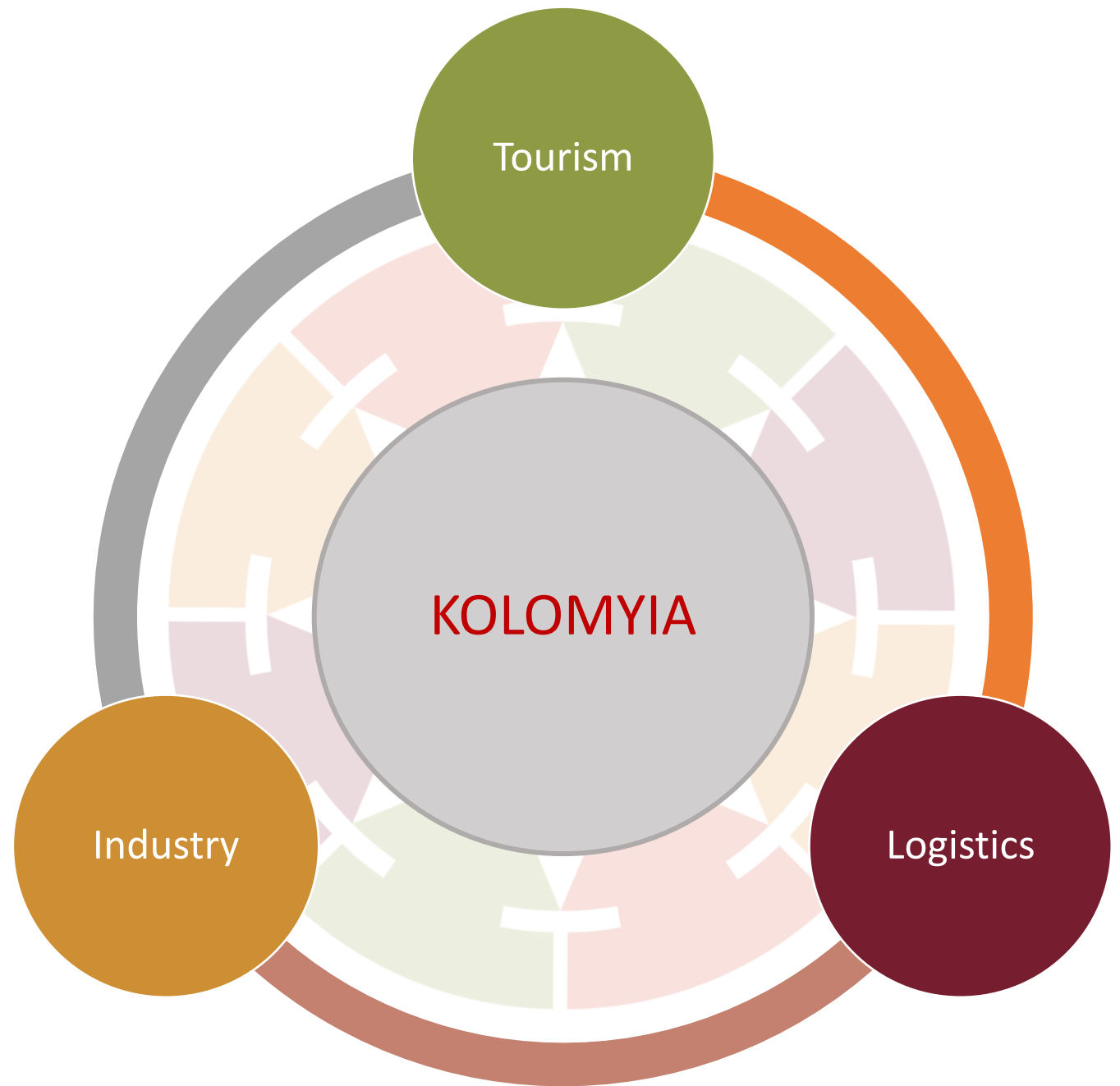

Historically, Kolomyia has always stood at the crossroads. Merchants from Poland, Lithuania, and the Ottoman Empire once met here. At one point, the city even had a port. Today, Kolomyia remains a hub of logistics. It offers the easiest access in Ivano-Frankivsk region to neighboring regional centers. The city is equidistant from the borders of Poland, Slovakia, and Moldova and sees hundreds of transit vehicles daily.

Kolomyia is accessible by road via highways H10 and P24. It offers the most convenient routes to Chernivtsi, Ternopil, and Uzhhorod.

Rail connections provide direct access to Kyiv, Odesa, or the Carpathians without going through Lviv.

Additionally, the presence of a small aviation airport opens up new opportunities for air travel such as "air taxi" services.

A City of Dozens of Enterprises



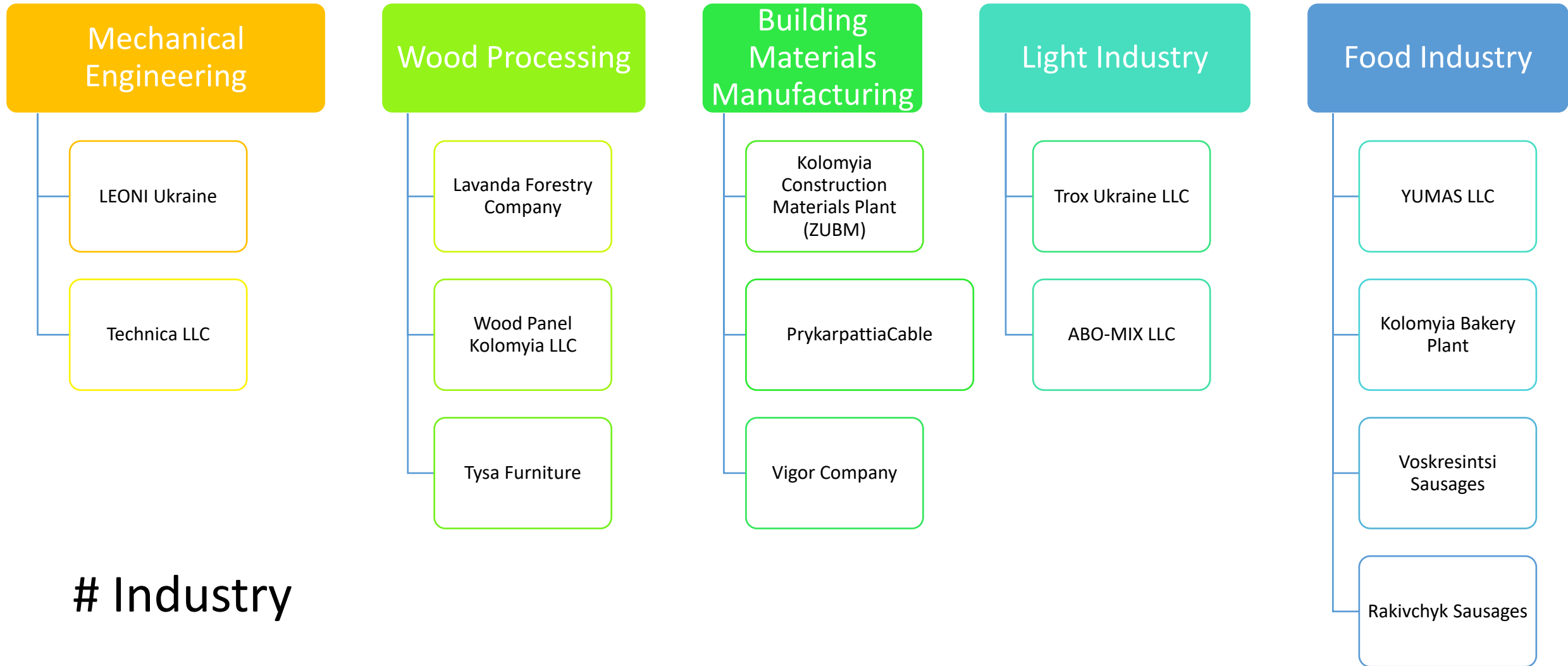

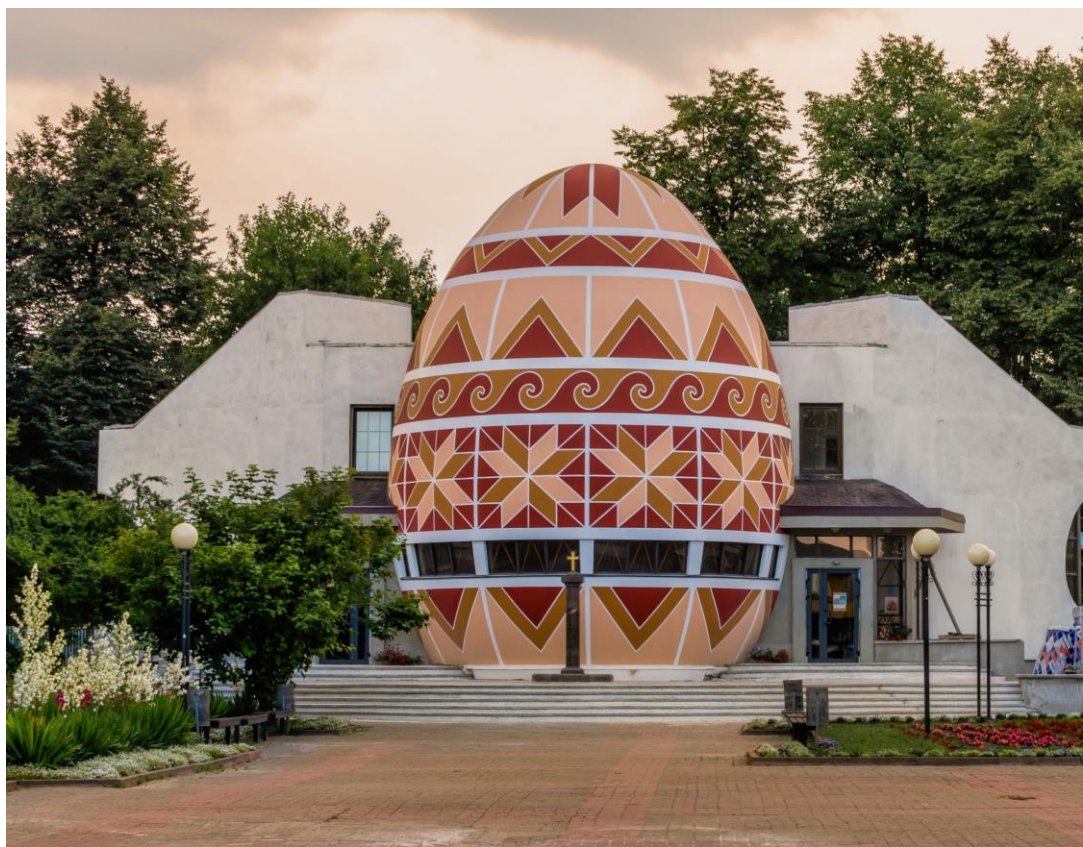
The Largest Enterprises in Kolomyia Municipality

But the highlight is the unique dish “**Kolomyia-style Filling**” — an authentic meal that can be found nowhere else. It's worth dedicating an hour just to try it!

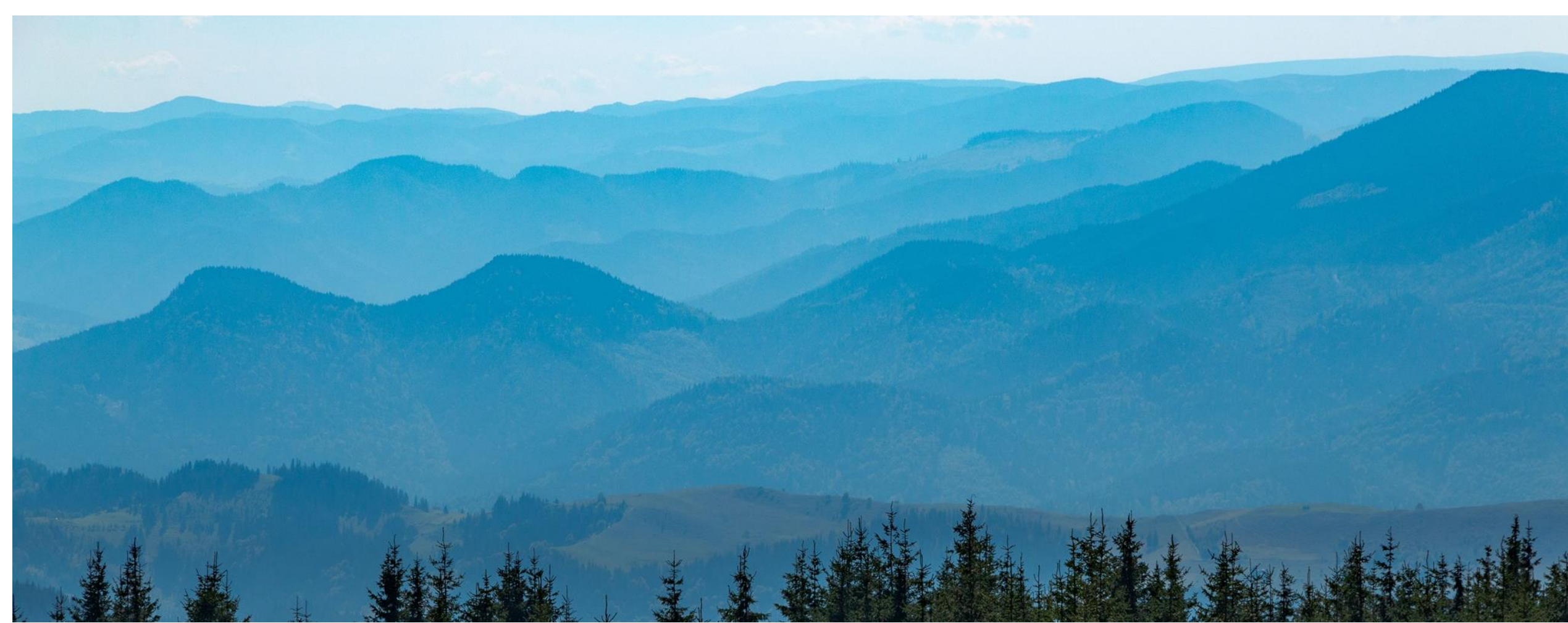
