PURPOSE AND AIMS OF THE UNION

Article 1

The Union's aim is to

MEMBERSHIP OF THE UNION

of the Union The Executive Board is authorized to decide upon the acceptance and fees for Members and Partners

Board has the right to expel it from the Union If a Member City or a Partner of the Union is not fulfilling the membership obligations, the Executive

The Union membership will expire upon a voluntary resignation from the Union, thereby terminating all mutual obligations of the parties thus involved
