



- Lack of motivation and social skills

- Unhealthy lifestyle
- Miss match between schools and labor market
- Lack of job experience
- Need for more effective career counselling
- Not enough co-operation between active and nonactive youngsters (social inclusion)
- Inflexible education system
- Too much pressure on youth to be successful
