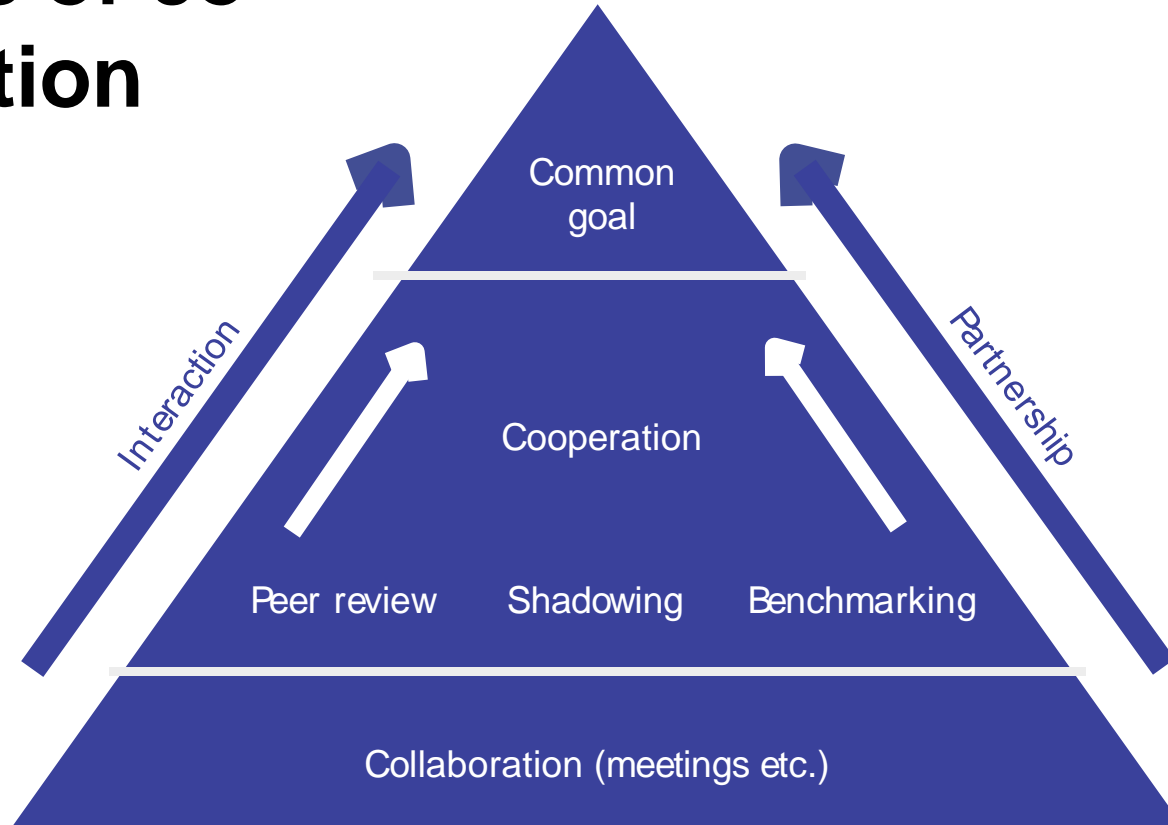
Background

- City of Turku has agreed to take responsibility of coordinating Early School Leavers Knowledge Platform, which goals are parallel to the goals of UBC Task Force
- City of Turku, Norden and Salar are building a new Flagship / Knowledge Platform Newly Arrived Refugees (TCA: BSR Integrate Now!)

How it works

- Knowledge Platforms offer two kind of services: Support and Development
- Support includes tools, materials, analyses and data, clinics and trainings
- Development includes study visits, collections of good practices, peer evaluation, peer development and new projects

Next steps

- April: study visit to Hamburg (theme is guidance and mentoring)
- June: BS Forum in Berlin (education workshops)
- June: Kick-off seminar in Stockholm (Newly Arrived Refugees)
- After that: at least four study visits / workshops every year; KP's services, joint projects
- 2018: BSR State of the Youth Guarantee Seminar
