Youth Conference

The Baltic Youth Project will bring 60 young people together from the Baltic Sea countries. During six working days they will exchange their experience on living conditions, youth policy and influence in countries and cities around the Baltic Sea.

The Baltic Youth Project is a youth exchange project mainly involving participants from local youth councils. It will prepare the participants for meeting with politicians at the general assembly of the Union of the Baltic Cities.

The young people will arrive a couple of days before the adults and plan a wide range of activities in order to influence the politicians and in order to make the meeting and dialogue fun and interesting for the young delegates.

There will be flashmobs, forum theatre, possibly a football match in addition to discussing e.g. youth mobility as a way of increasing learning possibilities, employment and entrepreneurship.
