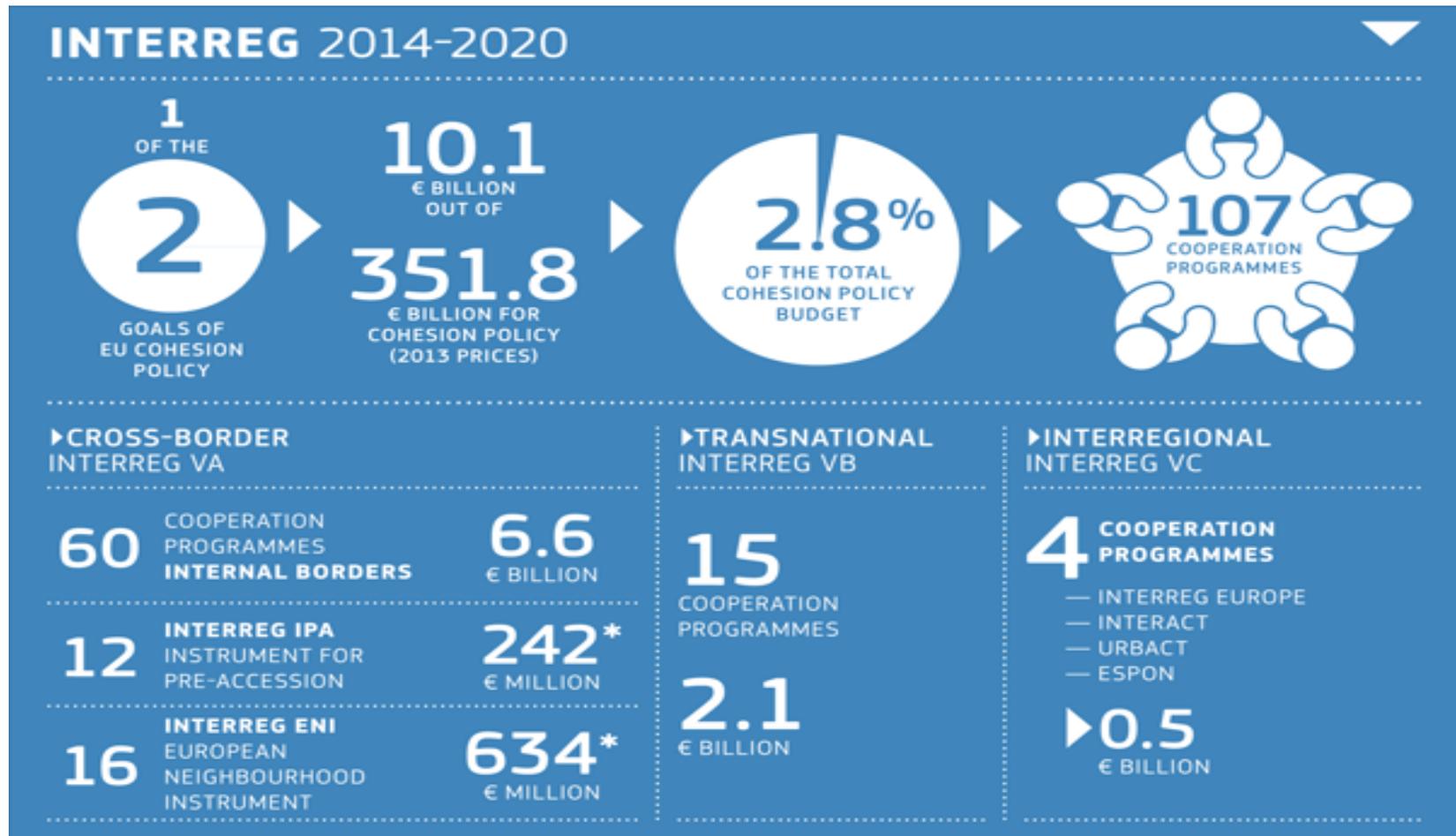

Funding opportunities via Interreg

11 Cross-border programmes: *Central Baltic; Estonia-Latvia; Latvia-Lithuania; Nord; Botnia-Atlantica; Sweden-Norway; Öresund-Kattegatt-Skagerrak; Germany-Denmark; South Baltic; Germany-Poland; Mecklenburg-Vorpommern / Brandenburg-Zachodniopomorskie:*

Priority areas: research and innovation, environment, entrepreneurship, sustainable transport, labour mobility, social inclusion.

New: all programmes open to private sector participation

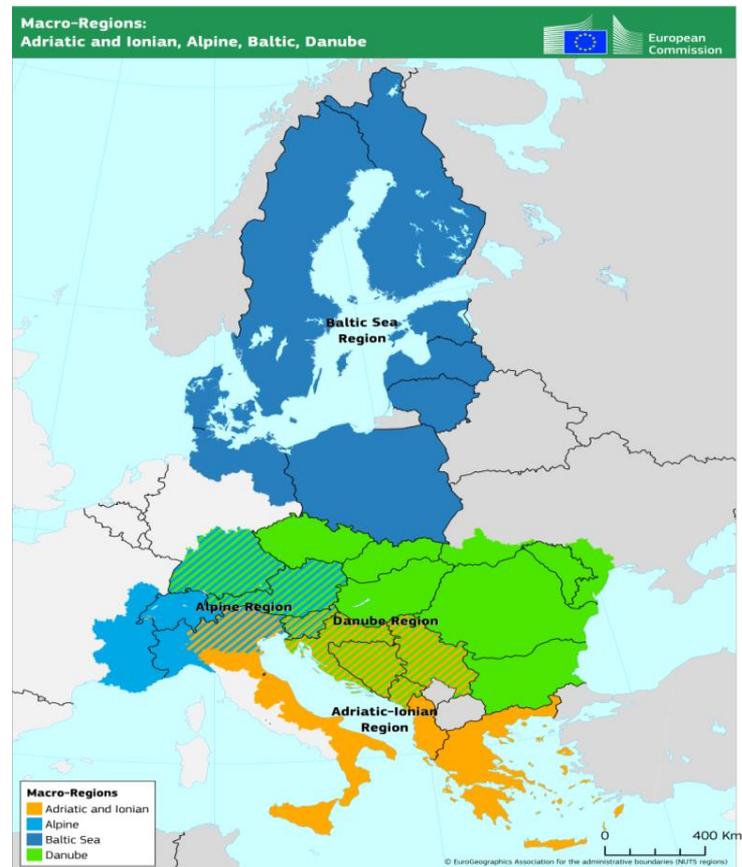
Transnational Interreg Baltic Sea region programme:

Priorities closely linked to EUSBSR objectives: innovation, achieving internal and external accessibility and managing the Baltic Sea as a common resource.

All Baltic Sea Interreg programmes represent more than EUR 1 billion in ERDF-funding

EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region (EUSBSR)

- First macro-regional strategy (2009)
- Eight EU Member States
- Three objectives: "Save the Sea", "Connect the region", "Increase prosperity" (12 sub-objectives)
- Common challenges/opportunities
- Action Plan with 17 thematic areas
- UBC in charge of horizontal action 'Capacity'
- Baltic Sea Region as frontrunner:
 - 2009: EUSBSR (Baltic Sea)
 - 2010: EUSDR (Danube)
 - 2014: EUSAIR (Adriatic-Ionian)
 - 2015: EUSALP (Alpine)



Current involvement of local actors in the EUSBSR

Local/regional authorities coordinating EUSBSR thematic areas (e.g. City of Turku: 'Neighbours'; Hamburg: 'Education'; UBC/Baltic Sea NGO Network/SI: 'Capacity',

EUSBSR Horizontal Action "Capacity" (e.g. Baltic Leadership Programme, Baltic Executive Programme),

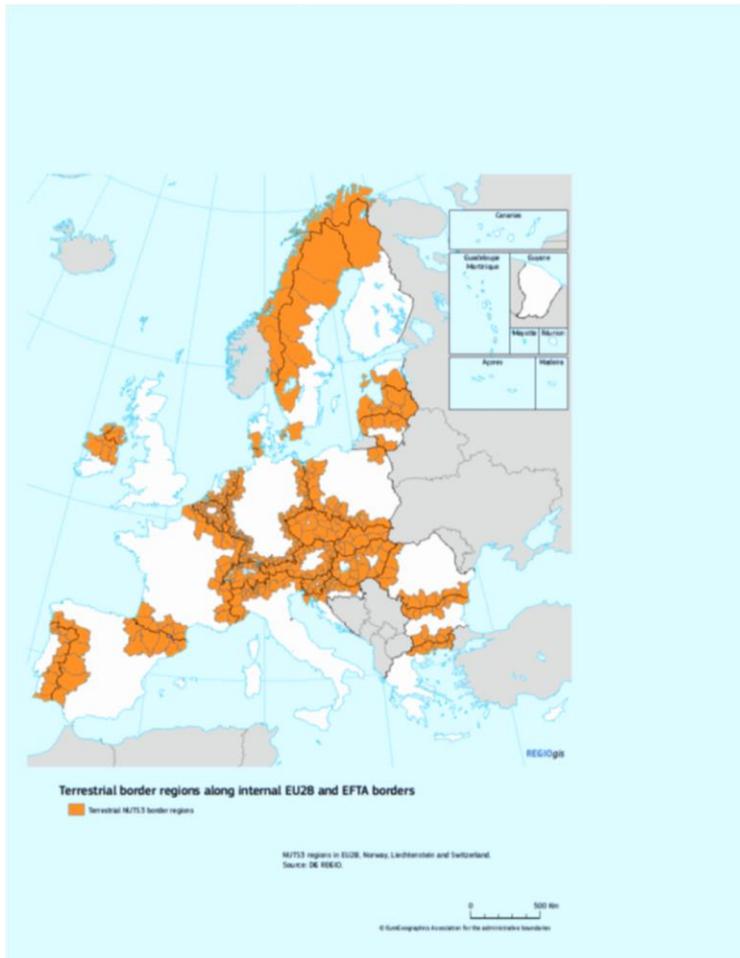

Border Regions matter...



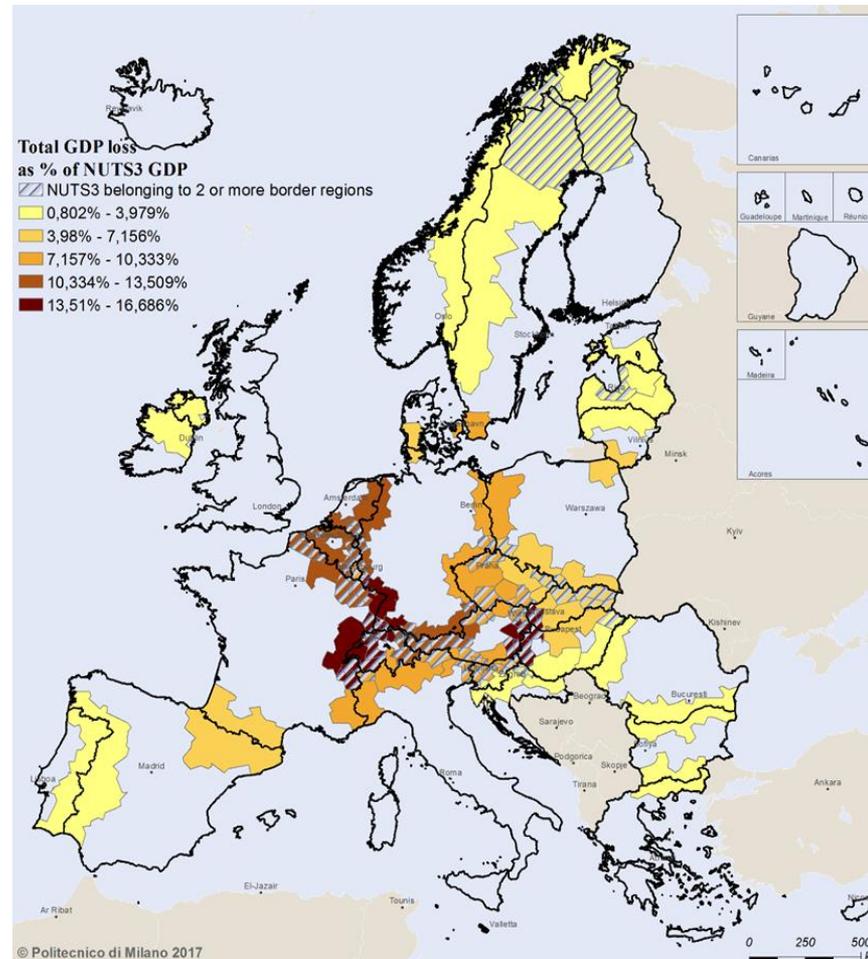
✓40% EU territory; 30% EU population (150m), 40 % EU GDP
✓**BUT** less economically developed, lower access to public services

AND they suffer...
Navigating different legal and administrative systems is still **complex, long and costly**

Persisting issues – unused potential

- ✓ costs of cross-border formalities 60% higher than domestic ones
- ✓ Complex tax, social security and recognition hampers cross-border labour mobility
- ✓ Local public transport across the border insufficient, too expensive, not integrated
- ✓ Health care provision across borders not fully exploited

Positive effect on growth of removing border obstacles
