PROJECTS

UBC CCC as a partner and a stakeholder:

1) Ars Baltica Creative Dialogue (ABCD) - project conclusion (July 2020)

Years active: 2018-2020. Partners: ARS BALTICA / Nordkolleg (DE), UBC CCC (LT/PL), Baltic Sea Cultural Center Gdansk (PL), Godsbanen Centre for Performing Arts (DK), Vabalava Theatre Tallinn (EE), RIXC / Centre for New Media Culture (LV), Territorium Film Kaliningrad (RU), City of Pori (FI). Outcome: 264 participants, 17 workshops, 9 countries. Topics: Audience development & Communication, Culture & Climate.

2) Culture 4 Climate (C4C) - seed money project start (December 2020)

Years active: 2020-2021. Partners: ARS BALTICA / Nordkolleg (DE), Council of the Baltic Sea States (CBSS) (SE), Ecologic Institute (DE), The Action University (DK), Kaunas Artists' House (LT), UBC CCC (LT/PL). Predicted outcome: the main project will integrate all BSR countries to co-design and implement long-lasting certification-methods that allow the chosen sectors to not only measure their impact, but also reduce their footprint and at the same time create a large outreach. For this a Pre-Phase is imperative, to (1) map the countries' individual needs by cultural sector, (2) create Piloting Tools (3) find a well balanced partner consortium to stem a BSR-wide large-scale project and last but not least (4) prepare a solid funding-framework.

3) Baltic Sea Cultural Cities (BSCC) - seed money project development (all through 2020)

Years active: 2018-2021.



Project overview



The Baltic Sea Cultural Cities is a project **aimed at connecting** cities, people, cultural organisations and professionals by **increasing the visibility** of the cultural diversity within the Baltic Sea Region.

Under the heading "water connects us, but culture unites us" it is aimed to **create** synergies and cooperation focusing on citizen participation and ownership rather than on competition among participating cities and communities.

It is a **cross-border initiative** to nominate with regular intervals the titles for the "Baltic Sea City/Region of Culture".

The project is currently being developed by a consortium of relevant organisations and stakeholders active in the region.

The lead partner is the **Council of the Baltic Sea States**. Partners include Agency for International Affairs and Regional Cooperation of Kaliningrad, Ars Baltica, Department of Youth and Culture of City of Kiel, City Culture Institute in Gdansk, Cultural Department of the Regional Councul of Ostrobothnia, Kaunas Artists' House, Ministry of Justice, European Affairs, Consumer Protection and Equality of Schleswig-Holstein, Union of Baltic Cities.

The initial development of the project is funded through seed money by the **Swedish Institute**.

- October 2019 Baltic Sea Cultural Cities workshop in Malmö
- December 2019 Workshop in Baltic Sea Cultural Cities project development in Kaunas

- October-November 2020 validating the concept with key stakeholders
- December 2020-February 2021 preparing operational roadmap
- March-May 2021 partner outreach and mapping possible funding tools.
