Towards Sustainable Green STEAM Ecosystems The G-STEAM project promotes young learners' interest and builds teachers' competence in science, technology, and green skills by increasing both the quantity and quality of STEAM in schools. To ensure 4238 students reached that future-oriented, sustainability-based green STEAM is deeply entrenched in the education landscape to fulfil local economic and societal needs, the project establishes local Green STEAM ecosystems in partner regions with the help of regional authorities, education providers, businesses, and other stakeholders. 246 teachers reached The project is divided into three sections: 1. STEAM practice in schools (The What): Developing green STEAM teaching practices, methods, and 70 schools reached 2. Teacher competence building in STEAM (The How): The development of green STEAM teacher training modules for in-service and pre-service training. 3. Building local STEAM ecosystems (The Why): Developing local collaborative platforms for schools, regions, businesses, and other stakeholders to keep STEAM locally relevant. 8 developed teacher training modules in use Expected outputs: A mature network of four functioning Green STEAM ecosystems in the Baltic Sea WP 3 Region will be strengthened with a significant expansion of STEAM in participating schools and regions, 174 teachers/ as well as increased teacher capacity in sustainable STEAM through specific Green STEAM training. The students reached Green STEAM Handbook will include the best teaching practices, a green teaching model, and a guide to entrenching STEAM through local ecosystem building.

Next time discussions on the study visits could be had within the commission before setting up the program. Participants to be able to choose the study visit location and focus on that one. An idea was given to organize a round table after the study visit.
