Introduction

The event builds on previous activities launched by the European Commission's <u>Just Transition Platform</u> to support stakeholders in Gotland to prepare the labour market for the green transition. JTP Groundwork, a capacity building service of the <u>Just Transition Platform</u>, assists Just Transition Fund (JTF) territories to implement their Territorial Just Transition Plans (TJTPs). JTP Groundwork assisted Gotland to analyse labour market needs, and implemented a workshop on how to develop and supports the labour needs of the region's industry and energy sectors as they transition to cleaner alternatives. The Technical Regional Forum aims to build on the analysis and the workshop with stakeholders in Gotland and share the findings with other JTF regions and neighbouring regions in the Baltic Sea to accelerate the green transition.

The event spans 2 days with panels, hands-on workshops, and a site visit. It aims to:

- Underline that investments in reskilling and upskilling of workers is priority for implementation of Just Transition Fund;
- Highlight approaches to strategically plan, develop, and attract skilled labour to strengthen the green transition process across EU;
- The specific challenges of attracting and developing skills in peripheral and island communities;
- Showcase examples from JTF regions in and around the Baltic Sea and other peripheral regions that have been successful in attracting or developing skilled labour;
- Convene Baltic Sea JTF territories, relevant CPMR-regions and other relevant stakeholders to discuss coordinated renewables deployment;
- Showcase examples of successful reskilling and upskilling JTF projects in other JTF regions.

Participants

This event welcomes regional stakeholders focused on developing the labour market for the green transition, as well as stakeholders focused on deploying renewables and grid development. Representatives from the JTF territories, the European Commission, and relevant EU funds representatives (tbd), as well as supporting associations and organisations will be invited to participate.

Suggestions for regions to be involved (as speakers and participants): JTF regions from Northern Sweden and Finland, Northern Germany (Uckermark and non-JTF region of Bremen), Denmark (JTF regions with shoreline: North Jutland, South Jutland), Latvian JTF regions with shoreline or close to the Baltic sea (Kurzeme, Zemgale, Vidzeme), Northern Netherlands (Groningen, Drenthe and Friesland), Baltic islands: Bornholm (Denmark), Åland (Finland) and Ösel (Saaremaa, Estonia).
